Job Title: Summer Greenkeeper
Responsible To: Head Greenkeeper
Direct Reports: None
Place of Work: The position will be based at one of the Sheffield City Trust golf courses, however, flexibility to work across all sites will be required.

Key Responsibilities:

1 Core Values

- To promote the Company's Core Values through personal behaviour and by challenging behaviour in others that is contrary to the Core Values.

2 Customer Service

- To assist in presenting the course in its best possible condition, in accordance with the course specification and instruction from the Head Greenkeeper and the Grounds Maintenance Manager.
- Tasks may include:
Switching and brushing; repairing divots; mowing and strimming tees, greens, fairways, banks, rough, semi-rough and surrounds; controlling pests, diseases and moss; renovating and repairing turf; applying pesticides and fertilizer (only when qualified); aerating and scarifying turf; applying top dressing; hollow coring, vertidrainage and tining; watering tees and greens; establishing and maintaining planted areas.

3 People

- Attend team meetings, making recommendations for improvements.
- Establish and maintaining effective working relationships with managers, colleagues and golfers via good communication and offering advice and help as appropriate.

4 Operations

- To undertake the following tasks on an ongoing basis in order to maintain a good standard of presentation of the course.
- Tasks may include:
Marking of hazards; Out of Bounds and GUR; moving tee markers; maintaining bunkers; maintaining golf course furniture, including tee mats in winter; litter pick and empty bins; changing holes; blowing leaves and raking.

5 Project Work

- To assist with any project work within competencies such as:
Course construction, including irrigation and draining schemes; constructing bunkers, paths, greens and tees etc.

6 Health and Safety

- Adhere to the Company's Health and Safety policy and procedures at all times.
- Knowledge of the location of First Aid equipment, Accident Book and Accident Reporting procedures.
- Wearing appropriate footwear and clothing.
- Communicating risks and hazards to the appropriate persons.
- Using tools and equipment consistent with Risk Assessments.
- Knowledge of fire prevention and emergency procedures.
- Following safe practices when operating/driving machinery and maintenance of machinery
